| Altar servers | Children who help the priest and deacon at Mass. |

| Extraordinary Ministers | People who have been given permission to help hand out the Eucharist. |
| Deacons | A man ordained for service in the Church. He receives Holy Orders and can proclaim the gospel and give a homily. He can perform baptisms and weddings. He is a deacon for life. A deacon can be married. |
| Priests | A man ordained for service in the Church. He receives Holy Orders and is a priest for life. He can perform all the sacraments of the Church. A priest is an extraordinary minister for the sacrament of Confirmation. He can celebrate Mass. A priest cannot marry. |
| Pastor | The priest who leads a Parish. |
| Bishop | Head of a Diocese, which is a group of parishes. He is the usual minister of Confirmation. |
| Cardinal | Honorific title given by Pope. |
| Pope | Visible head of the Roman Catholic Church on earth. The Pope is the bishop of Rome. |

All the *readings* we hear in the Liturgy of the word are from the *Bible*.

We hear about the words and actions of Jesus when the Gospel is proclaimed.

The *homily* is after the Gospel reading. This is when the Priest or Deacon talks about the Gospel and how we can live it today.

The *consecration* is the part of the Eucharistic prayer when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The *Nicene Creed* and the *General Intercessions* are part of the Liturgy of the Word.

Prayer is *talking* and *listening* to *God*.
