<i>Grace</i>	A gift from God that helps us lead a good life.

<i>Christmas</i>	The day when Jesus, God's Son, was born.
<i>Lent</i>	The 40 days when we prepare to celebrate Easter.
<i>Easter Tridumm</i>	Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday.
<i>Last Supper</i>	The first Mass – when Jesus broke the bread and shared the wine which He told us was His Body and Blood.
<i>Easter</i>	The day that Jesus rose from the dead.

<i>Pentecost</i>	The day when Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to the Apostles to give them courage to tell everyone about Jesus.

Who's Who In the Church?

<i>Altar servers</i>	Children who help the priest and deacon at Mass.
<i>Extraordinary Ministers</i>	People who have been given permission to help hand out the Eucharist.
<i>Deacons</i>	A man ordained for service in the Church. He receives Holy Orders and can proclaim the gospel and give a homily. He can perform baptisms and weddings. He is a deacon for life. A deacon can be married.
<i>Priests</i>	A man ordained for service in the Church. He receives Holy Orders and is a priest for life. He can perform all the sacraments of the Church. A priest is an extraordinary minister for the sacrament of Confirmation. He can celebrate Mass. A priest cannot marry.
<i>Pastor</i>	The priest who leads a Parish.
<i>Bishop</i>	Head of a Diocese, which is a group of parishes. He is the usual minister of Confirmation.
<i>Cardinal</i>	Honorific title given by Pope.
<i>Pope</i>	Visible head of the Roman Catholic Church on earth. The Pope is the bishop of Rome.

Mass

The Mass is *divided* into two parts:

- the Liturgy of the Word
- the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

All the *readings* we hear in the Liturgy of the word are from the *Bible*.

We hear about the words and actions of Jesus when the *Gospel* is proclaimed.

The *homily* is after the Gospel reading. This is when the Priest or Deacon talks about the Gospel and how we can live it today.

The *consecration* is the part of the Eucharistic prayer when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The *Nicene Creed* and the *General Intercessions* are part of the Liturgy of the Word.

Prayer is talking and listening to God.

There are different types of prayer – 2 of them are	
Adoration	When we tell God that we love Him.
Petition	When we ask God to help us.

There are **Ten Commandments** the first five are:

1. I am the Lord your God. You shall honor no other God but me.
2. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.
4. Honor your father and your mother.
5. You shall not kill.
