Jesus is both Divine and human.

The symbols of the Holy Spirit are wind, fire and dove.

Chrism is a mixture of olive oil and balm (a perfume). It is used in the sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. It is blessed by the Bishop during Holy Week.

The usual minister of Confirmation is the Bishop but he can designate someone else to confirm the children.

Confirmation completes Baptism and can be received only once.

The Holy Spirit gives us the strength to go out and be a witness or disciple of Jesus Christ.

The first part of the Confirmation rite is when the pastor presents/introduces the candidates to the Bishop.

The Holy Spirit comes to you when the Bishop anoints you by tracing a sign of the cross on your forehead. He then lays his hand on your forehead and says the words “Name be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit” and you respond “Amen”

The Bishop then says “Peace be with you” and you respond by saying “And with your spirit.”

The 4 marks of the Church are One, Holy, Catholic, & Apostolic.

The matter used in the Sacraments of:

Baptism ~ Water, light (candle), & Chrism

Confirmation ~ Chrism

Eucharist ~ Bread and wine

<i>The Parts of the Mass are:</i>	
<i>Introductory Rites</i>	The part when we prepare to celebrate, with the whole community, the Mass, which is the source and summit of our Catholic Faith.
<i>Liturgy of the Word</i>	When we hear the word of the Lord from the Bible.
<i>Preparation of the Altar & Gifts</i>	When the bread and wine, which will become Jesus' Body and Blood are brought to the Altar.
<i>Eucharistic Prayer</i>	Center and summit of the Eucharist Liturgy also called the Mass.
<i>Communion</i>	When we receive Jesus Body and Blood in the Eucharist.
<i>Dismissal</i>	When the Deacon sends us out to be disciples and witnesses of Christ.

Stations of the Cross
1) Jesus is condemned to death.
2) Jesus takes up His cross.
3) Jesus falls for the first time.
4) Jesus meets His sorrowful Mother.
5) Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry His cross.
6) Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
7) Jesus falls the second time.
8) Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.
9) Jesus falls the third time.
10) Jesus is stripped of his garments.
11) Jesus is nailed to the cross.
12) Jesus dies on the cross.
13) Jesus is taken off the cross.
14) Jesus is placed in the tomb.

Vocabulary Words	
<i>Candidate</i>	A person preparing to receive a sacrament.
<i>Confirmandi</i>	A person who is ready to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.
<i>Disciple/ Witness</i>	A person who speaks and acts the way Jesus did when he was on Earth.
<i>Apostle</i>	The first 12 men Jesus picked to help Him spread the word of God to others.
<i>Pentecost</i>	The day the Holy Spirit first came to the Apostles, 50 days after Easter.
<i>Grace</i>	A gift from God, which helps us to live as God, wants us to.
<i>Baptismal Promises</i>	When we say I do believe all the statements of faith written in the Apostle's Creed and promise to follow them.
<i>Sponsor</i>	A Catholic who has received all the sacraments in initiation and who has promised to help the candidate grow in their faith.
<i>Character or Mark</i>	Permanent imprint on our soul that shows we have been sealed with the Holy Spirit.
<i>Laying of Hands</i>	When the Bishop or Priest raises both arms in front of him and says a prayer, the power of the Holy Spirit passes through him to you.
<i>Bishop</i>	The person in charge of a diocese, the usual minister of Confirmation.
<i>Jesus</i>	Means God saves.
<i>Christ</i>	Means anointed one.

<i>Incarnation</i>	The truth that the son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, became man.
<i>Divine Inspiration</i>	The special guidance that the Holy Spirit gave to the human writers of the Bible.
<i>Catholic Social Teaching</i>	The teaching of the Church that calls all members to work for justice and peace as Jesus did.
<i>Miracle</i>	An extraordinary event that is beyond human power and is brought about by God.
<i>Body of Christ</i>	All Catholics on Earth.
<i>Christian</i>	Any person who believes that Jesus is God's Son and that Jesus is both human and Divine.
<i>Catholic</i>	Any person who is a Christian and believes that the Pope is the head of God's Church on Earth.
<i>Transubstantiation</i>	When the priest changes the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus.
