<i>Alleluia / Hosana</i>	Words meaning joy and honor. Like yelling Yeah!!!
<i>Amen</i>	So be it, I agree.
<i>Emmanuel</i>	Name for Jesus means God is with us.
<i>Creed</i>	Statement that says what we believe.
<i>Apostle's Creed</i>	This prayer is the summary of the Apostles' faith which was and is said during Baptism.
<i>Mystery</i>	Something we do not understand.
<i>Paschal</i>	Another word for Easter.
<i>Paschal Mystery</i>	Jesus dying and rising from the dead.
<i>Altar</i>	Table of the Lord where the Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated.
<i>Gospel</i>	Good news about Jesus.
<i>Covet</i>	To really want something that belongs to somebody else.
<i>Conscience</i>	The moral sense of our mind telling us what is right and wrong, based on faith and reason.
<i>Free Will</i>	The freedom and ability to choose what you want to do.

The *Blessed Trinity* is the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit.

*Sin* is freely choosing to do something we know is wrong.

The *Mass* is divided into two parts:

- the Liturgy of the Word
- the Liturgy of the Eucharist

### ***Liturgical Calendar***

The *Liturgical Calendar* begins on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent.

*Advent* is the 4 Sundays before Christmas when we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth at Christmas.

*Christmas* is the day we celebrate Jesus' birth – His becoming human.

*Ordinary Time* is the season when we learn about the life of Jesus and learn how to follow Him.

*Lent* is the season when we prepare to celebrate Jesus rising from the dead.

*Holy Thursday*, *Good Friday*, and *Holy Saturday* are the days we call the Easter Triduum.

*Holy Thursday* was the Last Supper, when the first Mass was celebrated.

*Good Friday* is the day we remember Jesus' dying on the cross for us.

*Easter* is the day we celebrate Jesus rising from the dead.

The *Easter Season* begins on Easter Sunday and ends on Pentecost Sunday.

*Pentecost* is 50 days after Easter. It is called the birthday of the Church when the Holy Spirit first came to us.

*Ascension Thursday* is the day Jesus rose up and went back to heaven.

<i>Parish</i>	A community of Catholic who live in the same neighborhood and who gather at Church for Mass.
<i>Diocese</i>	A group of parishes.
<i>Pastor</i>	Leader of a parish.
<i>Bishop</i>	Leader of a diocese.
<i>Pope</i>	Leader of church on earth.

Jesus gave us the *Beatitudes* to show us the Christian way of loving.

*Saints* are people who lived a good life on earth and are now in heaven.

We celebrate all of the saints on *All Saints Day*.

We are all *missionaries* because we should always be ready to spread the Good News to others.

Mary is truly the “*Mother of God*”

Mary was taken up to heaven on the *Assumption* which is celebrated on, August 15<sup>th</sup>.

<b>Prayer</b> is <i>talking</i> and <i>listening</i> to <u>God</u> .	
The 5 types of prayer are	
Adoration	When we tell God that we love Him.
Petition	When we ask God to help us.
Intercession	When we ask God to help someone else.
Thanksgiving	When we thank God for the gifts He has given us.
Praise	When we tell God that he is great & wonderful & the best.
