The **Mass** is *divided* into two parts:

- the Liturgy of the *Word*
- the Liturgy of the *Eucharist*.

<b>Prayer</b> is <i>talking</i> and <i>listening</i> to <u>God</u> .	
The 5 types of prayer are	
Adoration	When we tell God that we love Him
Petition	When we ask God to help us
Intercession	When we ask God to help someone else
Thanksgiving	When we thank God for the gifts He has given us
Praise	When we tell God that he is great & wonderful & the best

<b>Vocabulary Words</b>	
<i>Emmanuel</i>	Name for Jesus, means God is with us.
<i>Creed</i>	Statement that says what we believe.
<i>Apostle's Creed</i>	This prayer is the summary of the Apostles' faith which was and is said during Baptism.
<i>Nicene Creed</i>	This creed came after the Councils of Nicea and Constantinople – it is said by all Catholics during Mass.
<i>Chrism</i>	A mixture of olive oil and balm, a perfume.
<i>Mystery</i>	Something we do not understand.
<i>Lamb</i>	In the Old Testament the animal that was sacrificed as an offering to God.
<i>Paschal</i>	Another word for Easter.
<i>Paschal Lamb</i>	Name for Jesus, means Jesus was sacrificed for us so that we could be saved.
<i>Paschal Mystery</i>	Jesus dying and rising from the dead.
<i>Annunciation</i>	When the Angel Gabriel told Mary she was to be the Mother of Jesus.
<i>Altar</i>	In the Old Testament – table where an animal was killed as a sacrifice or offering to God.
<i>Altar</i>	In the New Testament – table of the Lord where the Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated.
<i>Mediator</i>	A person who helps 2 people or 2 groups come to an agreement.
<i>Consecration</i>	The part of the Mass when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus.
<i>Heaven</i>	A palace where we see God face-to-face forever.
<i>Hell</i>	Being separated from God forever.
<i>Purgatory</i>	A place where after death we can continue our journey – started on Earth – towards complete union with God in heaven.
<i>Communion of Saints</i>	Disciples on earth (us), those in Heaven and those in Purgatory.

The first 6 seasons in the **Liturgical Calendar** in order are:

1. Advent,
2. Christmas,
3. Ordinary Time,
4. Lent,
5. Easter Triduum,
6. Easter.

### **Liturgical Calendar**

The Liturgical Calendar begins on the first Sunday of Advent.

Advent is the season when we prepare to celebrate Christ's coming at Christmas.

The Christmas season is from Christmas Day to the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus.

Ordinary Time is the season when we learn about the life of Jesus and learn how to follow Him.

Lent is the season, which lasts 40 days, when we prepare to celebrate Jesus rising from the dead on Easter.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the celebration of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday.

Jesus gave us the gift of Himself in the sacrament of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday at the Last Supper.

Good Friday is the day that Jesus died on the Cross for us.

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are the days we call the Easter Triduum.

The Easter season begins on Easter Sunday and ends on Pentecost Sunday.

Pentecost is celebrated 50 days after Easter, when the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles, in the form of tongues of fire.

## **Bible**

The word Bible means library. The Bible contains 73 different books.

The Bible was written by many human authors under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Many different types of literary forms were used in the writing of the Bible.

The Bible is divided into the Old Testament and the New Testament.

The Old Testament is also called the Hebrew Scriptures.

The New Testament is a record of Jesus' life on earth.

An Epistle is a letter in the New Testament.

A Parable is a story Jesus told to teach us.

The Gospels are found in the New Testament.

The Gospels were written by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The Gospels are an announcement of the Good News about Jesus.

The Cross is the most widely used Christian symbol.

The Pope is the successor of Peter and the visible head of the Church on Earth.

Priests and deacons are the Church's ordained leaders.

Jesus is the mediator between God and people.
