The **Precepts of the Church** are:

1. You shall take part in the Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation.
2. You shall celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year.
3. You shall receive Holy Communion at least once a year during Easter time.
4. You shall fast and abstain on days of penance.
5. The faithful have the obligation of supporting the Church.

Vocabulary Words

<i>Faith</i>	A gift from God that allows us to believe in Him when we don't understand how something happens/happened. Some examples are when Jesus rose from the dead, and at Mass when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus.
<i>Covet</i>	To really want something that belongs to somebody else.
<i>Miracle</i>	An extraordinary event that is beyond human power and brought about by God. Jesus' miracles are signs of God's power and love.
<i>Canonize</i>	When a person is recognized for being a holy person during their life.
<i>Saint</i>	Title for the holy person after being canonized by the Church.
<i>Martyr</i>	A person who gives up his or her life rather than give up their Christian beliefs.
<i>Sin</i>	Freely choosing to do something we know is wrong.
<i>Mortal Sin</i>	A total break in our relationship with God, the Church and one another.
<i>Venial Sin</i>	A less serious offense, but one that weakens our relationship with God, one another and ourselves.
<i>Original Sin</i>	The first sin committed by human beings. It was committed by our first parents, Adam and Eve. This sin affects all human beings born into the world, with 2 exceptions <i>Mary the Mother of Jesus</i> and <i>Jesus</i> , who were conceived without this sin.
<i>Conscience</i>	The guiding voice within our hearts that help us to make choices in accord with the Truth of Christ.
<i>Angels</i>	Spiritual beings who honor and praise always and sometimes act as God's messengers.
<i>2 Great Commandments</i>	1) You should love the Lord your God with your whole heart, with your whole soul and with your whole mind; 2) You should love your neighbor as yourself.

<i>Last Supper</i>	The Passover meal that Jesus shared with His disciples on the night before He died – the first Mass.
<i>Bible</i>	Written by many human authors under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, it is divided into the Old Testament and the New Testament.
<i>Old Testament</i>	Also called the Hebrew Scriptures.
<i>New Testament</i>	A record of Jesus’ life on earth.
<i>Gospel</i>	Means the “Good News” about Jesus.
<i>Covenant</i>	A special agreement made between God and His people.
<i>Pentateuch</i>	First 5 books of the Old Testament.

Prayer is <i>talking and listening to God.</i>	
The 5 types of prayer are	
Adoration	When we tell God that we love Him
Petition	When we ask God to help us
Intercession	When we ask God to help someone else
Thanksgiving	When we thank God for the gifts He has given us
Praise	When we tell God that He is great & wonderful & the best

The 7 seasons in the **Liturgical Calendar** in order are:

1. Advent,
2. Christmas,
3. Ordinary Time,
4. Lent,
5. Easter Triduum,
6. Easter,
7. Ordinary Time.

The calendar of the church year is called the Liturgical Calendar.

The Advent season is a time to prepare with prayer and reflection for Christ's coming at Christmas.

Christmas celebration of Christ's birth and wonder of God's love.

Ordinary Time is the usual time of the church when the Sundays are counted: 1st, 2nd, etc. During this season the Gospels tell us about the life of Jesus and how we may follow him.

Lent the 40 days when we prepare to celebrate Easter by praying, fasting, and almsgiving.

Triduum means three days.

The 3 days that proclaim the Paschal Mystery are called the Easter Triduum. The 3 days are Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

Good Friday is the only day during the year when no Mass is celebrated.

Easter is the celebration of Jesus' rising from the dead, the holiest day of the Church year.

Pentecost is 50 days after Easter. This was when the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles in the forms of tongues of fire.
