The **Precepts of the Church** are:

1. You shall take part in the Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation.
2. You shall celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year.
3. You shall receive Holy Communion at least once a year during Easter time.
4. You shall fast and abstain on days of penance.
5. The faithful have the obligation of supporting the Church.

3)	Jesus <i>falls</i> for the <i>first time</i> .
4)	Jesus <i>meets</i> His sorrowful <i>Mother</i> .
5)	<i>Simon of Cyrene</i> helps Jesus carry His cross.
6)	<i>Veronica</i> wipes the face of Jesus.
7)	Jesus <i>falls</i> the <i>second time</i> .
8)	Jesus <i>meets</i> the <i>women of Jerusalem</i> .
9)	Jesus <i>falls</i> the <i>third time</i> .
10)	Jesus is <i>stripped</i> of his garments.
11)	Jesus is <i>nailed</i> to the cross.
12)	Jesus <i>dies</i> on the cross.
13)	Jesus is <i>taken off</i> the cross.
14)	Jesus is <i>placed</i> in the <i>tomb</i> .

The 5 types of prayer are	
Adoration	When we tell God that we love Him
Petition	When we ask God to help us
Intercession	When we ask God to help someone else
Thanksgiving	When we thank God for the gifts He has given us
Praise	When we tell God that He is great & wonderful & the best

Vocabulary Words	
<i>Liturgy</i>	Prayer by people when they worship God and honor saints. The official public prayer of the Church.
<i>Liturgical</i>	Any church practice such as hymns, prayers, and services.
<i>Liturgical Calendar</i>	Shows the seasons of the church year.
<i>Ministers of the Church</i>	Pope, Bishop, Priests, Deacons, Extraordinary Ministers, Altar Servers.
<i>Bishop</i>	Usual minister of Confirmation, but he can designate someone else.
<i>Magisterium</i>	The official teaching authority of the Church, consisting of the pope and the bishops.
<i>Marks of the Church</i>	One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic.
<i>Social Justice</i>	Opposing every form of injustice in society and working to promote justice for all people.
<i>Baptism</i>	<u>Sacrament</u> when our parents and godparents said “yes” to God promising Him we would continue to be faithful Catholics.
<i>Renewal of Baptismal Promises</i>	When we say “yes” to God promising Him we will continue to be faithful Catholics.
<i>Confirmation</i>	The <u>Sacrament</u> when the Holy Spirit comes down to us in a special way.
<i>Chrism</i>	A mixture of olive oil and balm, a perfume, used in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. It is blessed by the bishop during Holy Week.
<i>Conscience</i>	Our most basic awareness that some things are right and some things are wrong – when God speaks to us directly.
<i>Our Father</i>	Prayer that Jesus taught us, it is a summary of the Gospels.
<i>Gospels</i>	The “Good News” that the promised Savior in the Old Testament has come. Also gives us information about Jesus’ life and teachings.

<i>Evangelization</i>	Sharing the good news of Jesus and the love of God with all people, at all times.
<i>Schism</i>	Refusal to follow to the leadership of Peter's successor, the Pope.
<i>Heresy</i>	A religious teaching that is against a Church belief revealed by God.
<i>Eucharistic Fast</i>	When those planning on receiving Communion abstain from all food & drink (except water) 1 hour before receiving Communion.
<i>Real Presence</i>	True presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
<i>Martyr</i>	A person who willingly gives up his/her life rather than give up their Faith.
<i>Missionary</i>	To be Catholic, to be ready and willing to share our Faith with others wherever we meet them.
<i>Disciples</i>	All people who try to follow Christ's teachings.
<i>Prophet</i>	Someone who speaks on behalf of God, defends the truth, and works for justice.
<i>Sponsor</i>	A Catholic who is at least 16 years old, has received the Sacraments of Initiation, is an example of Christian living, is respected by the candidate, will help him/her grow their in faith and is in good standing with the Church.

The 7 seasons in the **Liturgical Calendar** in order are:

1. Advent,
2. Christmas,
3. Ordinary Time,
4. Lent,
5. Easter Triduum,
6. Easter,
7. Ordinary Time.

Calendar

<i>Advent</i>	A time to prepare with prayer and reflection for Christ's coming at Christmas.
<i>Christmas</i>	Celebration of Christ's birth, the wonder of God's love. Jesus is the greatest sign of God's love.
<i>Ordinary time</i>	The usual time of the church, the Sundays are counted 1 st , 2 nd , etc. During this season the Gospels tell us about the life of Jesus and how we may follow Him.
<i>Lent</i>	40 days when we prepare to celebrate Easter by praying, fasting, and almsgiving.
<i>Triduum</i>	Means "three days".
<i>Easter Triduum</i>	The 3 days that proclaim the Paschal Mystery: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday.
<i>Holy Thursday</i>	Last Supper, when Jesus gave Himself to us in the Eucharist.
<i>Good Friday</i>	The day we remember Jesus' suffering and death on the cross.
<i>Holy Saturday</i>	The day when the Easter Vigil is celebrated.
<i>Good Friday</i>	The only day during the year when no Mass is celebrated, the day Jesus died.
<i>Easter</i>	Celebration of Jesus' rising from the dead, holiest day of the Church year.
<i>Ascension Thursday</i>	Day we celebrate Jesus' rising back to Heaven.
<i>Pentecost</i>	50 days after Easter, when the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles in the form of tongues of fire.
